It is always sad to lose a friend and fellow Amateur Radio operator. July 2025 has been doubly sad because of the passing of two long time members of the Macon County ARC. Larry Willingham, KØARS and Walt Slover Jr. KCØELC will be missed greatly by all who knew them. I have previously shared their obituaries, so I'm trying not to repeat that information. It would be good to remember their families in our thoughts and prayers.



Larry, KØARS, was an outstanding CW operator and had literally worked the world. He had made Amateur Radio contacts in every country on earth with the exception of North Korea. He helped many of us prepare to pass our exams and become Amateur Radio operators. Larry started young and never lost his passion for the magic of Ham Radio. We will miss him very much.



Walt Slover Jr, KCØELC, was quite young when he passed his exams and was active for quite a while, but his work in Scouting and his job at the Moberly Prison, became an important priority in his life. He never lost his interest in Amateur Radio and he became much more active in the years after he retired from work. Walt's health became an issue in his life and I can't imagine how many operations that he had to have to be able to get back on his feet. During all that time, he never gave up. He kept improving his station and operating skills. Walt's picture above was of him in his wheel chair setting up for ARRL Field Day in 2021. We are sad he is no longer with us.
